The boxes will be available Sunday, October 13, after morning worship. Plan to turn in your boxes by November 10 and encourage your whole family to get involved.

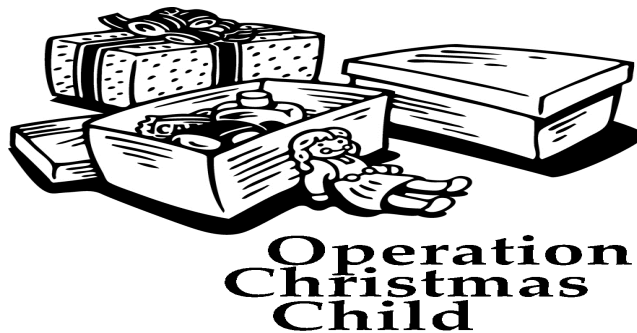

Women's Ministry Promotes Breast Cancer Awareness

In honor of Breast Cancer Awareness Month, the Women's Ministry Council would like to honor two women of our church who are breast cancer survivors. **Mother Margaret Robinson** and **Mother Shirley Nevils** were interviewed by Cheryl Mason and Lisa Jones about their experiences with the disease. The following are excerpts from those interviews:

Mother Robinson who is from Chicago and has four children, found out about her diagnosis after having her yearly mammogram. Because her cancer was detected early, her treatment included surgery and radiation instead of chemotherapy. She says that she received strength to make it through the process, from her family, her faith in God and her church. She really expressed how Zion really helped her during her illness. Her advice to other women who are or will be diagnosed with breast cancer is to always remember to get your annual mammogram. "Don't put it off because early detection is the key to conquering breast cancer." Mother Robinson has been cancer free for 13 years.

Mother Nevils went to the doctor in 2008 for a routine exam and the doctor detected a lump in her breast and ordered a mammogram as soon as possible. She says because she didn't have any pain, she didn't think it could possible for her to be sick. Mother Nevils said she got bad news and good news from the doctor. The bad news was that she did have cancer in one of her breast. The good news was that they didn't have to remove "her girls". Her treatment was chemotherapy. She says that she has had many illnesses since then but the Lord is not finished with her yet. She has been cancer free for five years. Her next mammogram is this December and if you see her, she wants you to remind her not to miss that appointment.

We praise God for both of these wonderful ladies who are living proof that God does perform miracles. Pastor Hill and the Women's Ministry Council would like to thank them for their courage in sharing their experiences with us and we pray that they will continue to be a blessing to other women.
