Every Tribal Leader must report your time and location and teach or preacher to the church office by Sunday, September 28.



Brother FRANK LATIMORE was an Usher, Sunday School student, a Vanguard member and a supporter of the Lord's Kitchen and the Fragment Center. He shared his time, wisdom and finances with his family, friends, church. He His trade was fixing cars and he helped so many with their car problems. His wife, Freeda, and children remain with us.

Sister FRANCES WEATHERSPOON was one of our long time members of the church who came out of a wonderful church family, the sister of Sister Williams who was the wife of Reverend Freeman Williams of San Bernardino, one of the sons of Zion. She was a guiet, well-mannered, and intelligent person.

Brother WILLIAM TALLEY was one of the most useful men of our church in that his truck was available to pick up anything we needed. He worked diligently at the Lord's Kitchen and was an active player on the Mount Zion Bowling Teams.

Sister **WILLA REMBERT** started the Speak Gospel Hands Ministry where we were able to teach the Gospel to the deaf and hearing impaired members of our church. Because of her faith and her commitment to the deaf community, her work continues through the Speak Gospel Hands Ministry where Andrea Ward is the current Team Leader.

Deacon RUBIN WOMACK was a trustee, Vanguard leader, member of the Male Chorus and Men's Ministry, and member of the Baptism Committee. He was a family man; he and his family were loyal members and neighbors who always kept a watchful eye on our church facilities. He was a physical therapist and we are blessed to have his daughter, Linda, still among us.

Sister **NETTIE B. LUKE** was a choir member, noonday prayer band member, Vanguard leader, tither, one who opened her home and cooked for so many summer workers, one who picked up people needing rides.

Sister MARIE GARDNER was a quiet member who faithfully carried out her responsibilities as a member of the church, especially Circle #3. She was a very dedicated family lady.

Deacon **HENRY ROSS** dedicated his whole life which included his material possessions to the advancement of our church. He used his resources to keep Mount Zion going many times. The record reveals that when Mount Zion was threatened with foreclosure, Brother Ross rescued the church. He was Pastor Hill Sr's personal friend and he and his wife were the godparents of our current Pastor Hill II.

Brother JOHN GADBERRY was a Christian father of four, a husband of one wife for fifty-two years. One of his daughters, Janet Johnson, was a faithful member here in Zion for years.

Sister LILLIE WILLIAMSON joined Mount Zion in 1946 and remained an active, loyal and dedicated member until her death. She was a member of Circle 13, a Sunday School student, sang in the Sanctuary Choir, and was a member of the Mothers' Board. She had the gift of helps.

Sister **LETRAL GIBSON** was a faithful, supportive member of our church in spite of her personal illnesses. She was a great supporter of her husband, Brother Tyree Gibson.


